Choose the best car seat for your youngest passengers

Safety is your No. 1 concern when driving with small children.

The proper car seat is crucial. Here's how to choose one that protects your most precious cargo:

- **Check the safety label.**

Make sure it meets or exceeds federal safety requirements for carrying children.

- **Be cautious used seats.**

A previously owned seat that's more than six years old may not be safe. Look for missing parts, cracks, or other signs of wear and tear.

Call the manufacturer to ask about durability and recalls.

- **Get the seat that fits your child.** Infant seats are designed for children from birth to about 20-35 pounds. Some can be converted to hold a child up to about 40 pounds. Otherwise, you'll need a front-facing safety seat capable of holding children until they reach 40 pounds, and after that a booster seat can be used until they hit about 80 pounds. Keep careful track of how big your children grow.

- **Learn the safety belt test.** When your child is between 8 and 12 years old, he or she may be ready to ride with just a seat belt. Do the child's knees bend at the edge of a regular car seat? Does the belt ride low on his or her hips? Does the shoulder belt lie on the child's collar or shoulder? Does the child sit comfortably with seat belt and shoulder strap correctly fastened? If any of the answers to these questions are no, keep the child in a safety seat until he or she has grown sufficiently.



Save your cash when you eat out

Eating in restaurants can get expensive in a hurry. When you want to get out of the house but you don't want to spend a lot, try these tips to lower your tab:

- **Have a snack first.** Eat something healthy before you head out. Then order a smaller meal or an appetizer instead of a full dinner.

- **Skip the extras.** Don't have cocktails or order dessert. These can add up quickly. Have a glass of wine and your own dessert at home instead.

- **Go out for dessert only.** You can prepare an inexpensive yet romantic meal at home, then go out for ice cream or your favorite dessert afterward.



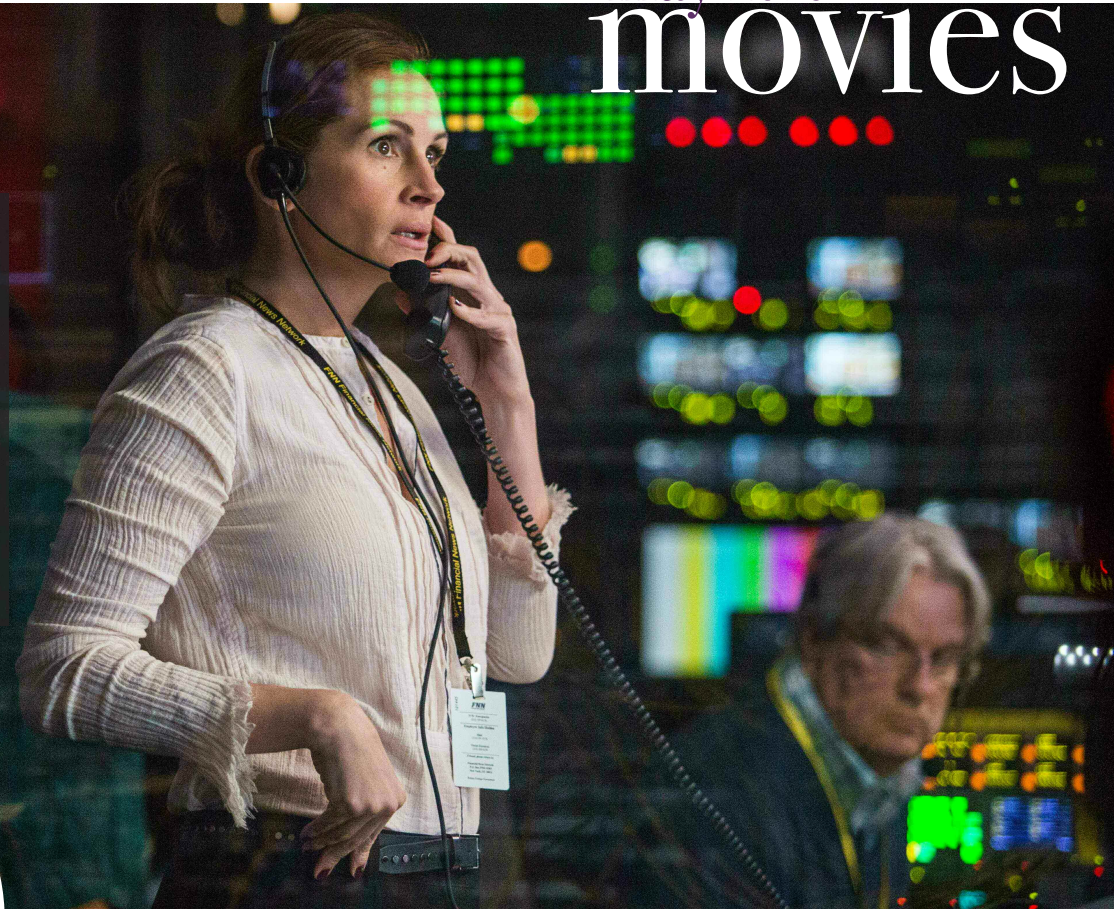
The perfect wedding gets more expensive

You can't buy love, but you can spend a lot of money on your wedding. A study by Thumbtack, an organization devoted to wedding services, found that the average wedding costs \$12,189, a figure that takes in the cost of the venue, bridal dress, rings, and a guest list of 98 people.

The typical couple is expected to spend about 20 percent more—\$2,000—on a wedding this year than in 2015, thanks in part to a 26 percent rise in formal receptions and a 32 percent increase in plated dinners. In addition, cakes are growing taller, due to a 55 percent increase in requests for three-tier cakes over 2015.

The most expensive U.S. city to get married in is New York City, with an average cost of \$16,077, followed by Philadelphia (\$15,434), Pittsburgh (\$14,287), and Baltimore (\$14,261). Getting hitched in Sacramento will set you back just \$11,349.

During their investigation, they uncover a shocking conspiracy that reaches up to the highest circles of power.

CAPTAIN AMERICA: CIVIL WAR Steve Rogers (**Chris Evans**) is leading the newly formed team of Avengers in their continued efforts to safeguard humanity. But after another incident involving the Avengers results in collateral damage, political pressure mounts to install a system of accountability, headed by a governing body to oversee and direct the team. The new status quo fractures the Avengers, resulting in two camps—one led by Steve Rogers and his desire for the Avengers to remain free to defend humanity without government interference, and the other following Tony Stark's (**Robert Downey, Jr.**) surprising decision to support government oversight and accountability.

ANGRY BIRDS The movie takes us to an island populated entirely by happy, flightless birds – or almost entirely. In this paradise, Red (**Jason Sudeikis**), a bird with a temper problem, speedy Chuck (**Josh Gad**), and the volatile Bomb (**Danny McBride**) have always been outsiders. But when the island is visited by mysterious green piggies, it's up to these unlikely outcasts to figure out what the pigs are up to.

ALICE THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS When Alice (**Mia Wasikowska**) wakes up in Wonderland she must travel through a mysterious new world to retrieve a magical scepter that can stop the evil Lord of Time before he turns forward the clock and turns Wonderland into a barren, lifeless old world. With the help of some new friends, Alice must also uncover an evil plot to put the Queen of Hearts back on the throne. **Johnny Depp, Anne Hathaway** and **Helena Bonham Carter** also star.

THE LOBSTER A love story set in the near future where single people, according to the rules of The City, are arrested and transferred to The Hotel. There they are obliged to find a matching mate in 45 days. If they fail, they are transformed into an animal of their choosing and released into The Woods. A desperate Man escapes from The Hotel to The Woods where The Loners live and falls in

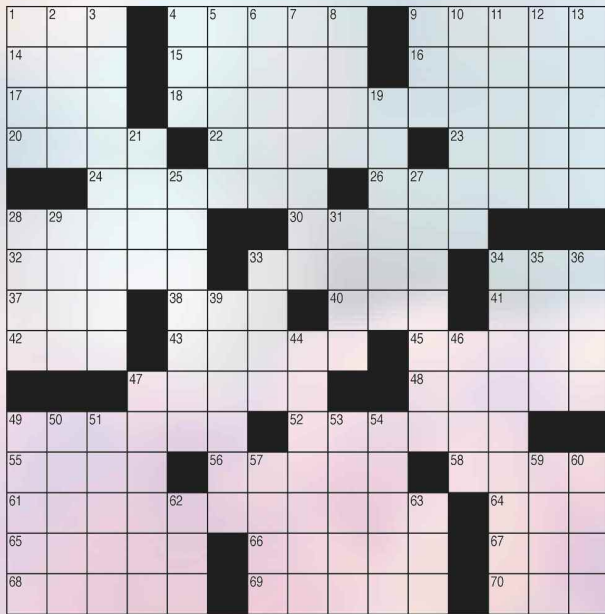
love, although it is against their rules. **Colin Farrell, Rachel Weisz** and **John C. Reilly** star.

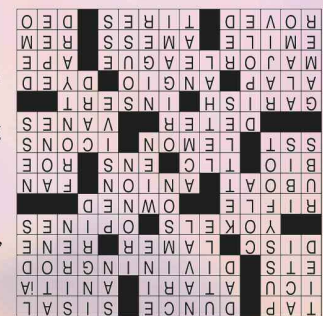
