Healthier Picnicking

Planning a summer picnic? Remember these deli dos & don'ts when making or ordering your favorite sandwich: • Hold the mayo. Extra tip: Be sure to make this request even if you are ordering a mayonnaise-based salad sandwich such as tuna. Many places will still put additional mayo on the bread! • For fat-free tasty spreads, request one of the following: vinegar (this tastes surprisingly good), diet Italian dressing, or mustard. • Add extra lettuce, tomatoes and onions instead of adding meat. • Always choose the leanest cuts of meat. • Hold the chips, oil, and cheese unless lowfat is available. Enjoy!





Stocking a kitchen with everything you need can be expensive and complicated. The Chicago Tribune asked a panel of experts to recommend 10 basic items they couldn't do without and eight extras that they'd love to have. Here they are:

- Good cookware. Heavy-duty cookware is usually best, the more expensive brands usually last longer and cook more evenly. Theo Gilbert, a professional chef, says he can make almost anything in a 3-quart sauté pan with a lid. Dana Benigno, a cooking teacher, recommends a 12-inch skillet with a lid, a 10-inch, slanted-sides sauté pan, an 8-quart stock pot and a 4-quart sauce pan.
- An 8-or-10-inch chef's knife and a paring knife. You should be able to handle just about anything with these two knives. To buy the right size knife go to a kitchenware store and see what they feel like in your hand.
- Sharpening steel. Most experts run their knives over sharpening steel before each use. This hones the knife, but does not actually sharpen it. (A sharpening stone is usually required.)
- Heat resistant silicone spatula. With these you'll probably never melt another spatula. They can withstand heat up to 500 degrees.
- Durable wooden spoons. They're great for long stirs because the handles won't get hot. They

also won't scratch your non-stick pans. Cherry, olive or boxwood are usually the best.

- Food thermometer. Get an instant read. They work quickly and measure from 0 to 222 degrees.
- Measuring spoons and cups. Buy good brands to make sure your measures are correct. Spoons can be used for dry and liquid measures. For cups though, you'll want to buy a set of dry measuring cups because you'll want to level them off when measuring. For liquids, buy a pitcher measuring up to either two or four cups.
- A jellyroll pan or a sheet pan. Jellyroll pans can be made into roasters by inserting a rack and if you flip it over it can be used as a cookie sheet. If you buy a sheet pan, buy a 13-by-18 inch.
- **Cutting boards.** Get one flexible, lightweight plastic one. That way you can transfer what you chop into your pots and pans. It is also dishwasher safe, so you can cut meats on it. For vegetables you should have a wooden board. Buy the biggest one you have space for in your kitchen.
- Balloon whisk. It can take care of a lot of jobs for you, such as aerating, whipping cream, emulsifying a dressing or getting lumps out of your sauces.
- The extras: a serrated peeler, strainers, a scale, grater/zester, oven thermometer, a covered Dutch oven, a cast-iron grill pan and an electric mixer.



Have a safe road trip

Here's how to make your next long-distance car trip enjoyable and safe ...

Family car trips are a summer standard. Here's how to make your next long-distance car trip enjoyable and safe:

- Pack a first-aid kit, water, blankets, snacks, and a flashlight.
- Bring headphones for all electronic devices so noise doesn't distract the driver.
- Schedule frequent rest stops so kids don't get restless.
- Keep all doors locked. If you have electric windows that can be controlled by the driver, lock them, too.
- Don't let kids lie down in the car. They can't be protected by seat belts in the prone position.
- Never put infants in the front seat.
- Never store materials like books and stereo equipment on the shelf behind the back seat. If you stop suddenly, these items can be thrown forward with tremendous force.



New clothing: Wash, then wear

Should you wash that new shirt or sweater before wearing it? Probably, especially if it's clothing for a child.

Dr. Jennifer Shu, a pediatrician who answers questions on the CNN website, cautions that clothes have probably been handled by many different people in factories and stores before reaching your shelves.

In addition, clothing may have been sprayed or treated with chemicals to prevent bacteria growth or keep them smelling fresh. Wash new clothes, or at least air them out thoroughly, before letting them get close to any sensitive skin.


