Fire Safety Tips

National Fire Prevention Week is October 8-14. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) wants to remind us of danger in the kitchen: the possibility of a cooking fire. According to the latest NFPA research, cooking is the leading cause of home fires. One out of three home fires begins in the kitchen, more than any other place in the home. Cooking fires are also the leading cause of home fire-related injuries.

When called to a fire that started in the kitchen, firefighters say the residents often tell them that they only left the kitchen for a few minutes. Sadly, that's all it takes for a fire to start. Here are some safety tips to keep in mind:

- Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling, broiling, or boiling food.
- If you must leave the room, even for a short period, turn off the stove.
- When you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly. Stay home and use a timer.
- If you have young children, use the stove's back burners whenever possible.
- Keep young children and pets at least three feet away from the stove.
- When you cook, always wear clothing with tight-fitting sleeves.
- Keep potholders, oven mitts, wooden utensils, paper and plastic bags, towels, and anything else that can burn, away from your stovetop.
- Clean up food and grease from burners and stovetops.

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Ensure success on your next big project

You've been put in charge of a major project at work, and you know that many potential pitfalls stand between you and its success. If you can anticipate them, you'll be better able to get the job done—and show people that you can be trusted with responsibility and authority. Here's what to do:

- **Get real support from the top.** For every major project, some people and departments will be reluctant to share information or change how they do things. Before you get started, make sure upper management is behind you. If you sense that they're not

really committed to the project, slow down and find out what kind of initiative they would be more enthusiastic about.

- **Gather input from all relevant stakeholders.** No one likes to be uprooted or shoved around without consent, and a project that calls for major change will run into problems if the people involved feel like you haven't taken their needs into account. Remember to address the interests of three major groups: the people who will implement the plan, everyone who will be affected by it, and those who have to pay for it.

- **Decide on details up front.** You'll bog down quickly if you're constantly changing the specs of a project. People won't act with urgency if they don't know exactly what they're trying to do, and how. Your input from stakeholders will help you define the project's requirements.

- **Keep expectations realistic.** Tell people how your initiative will benefit them, but don't oversell it. Let them know as accurately as possible what the project will accomplish, and when, but caution them not to expect the sun, moon, and stars on the first day it's implemented.



October is fire prevention month

They look nice and smell good, but candles have become a serious nationwide problem. While fires from other causes have dropped over the past decade, the number of candle fires continues to rise.

This year, Fire Prevention Week is October 8th thru 14th and we want to take this opportunity to remind everyone to be careful when using candles in the home.

- Place them correctly in a fire-safe holder and on a sturdy table that is not close to anything flammable.
- Never place a candle in a small enclosed area such as a bookshelf.
- Check your candles frequently to make sure they haven't burned too low. Never leave them unattended.
- Put candles out if you are dozing in a chair.
- Don't use candles around small children. They may be fascinated by the flame and knock the candle over.
- Be sure to always have a fire extinguisher available.

Sea Salt Caramel Popcorn

Yield: 3 quarts

- 2 quarts popped popcorn
- 1 1/2 cups pecan halves
- 1/2 cup almonds
- 1 1/3 cups granulated sugar
- 1 cup (2 sticks) butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup light corn syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 teaspoon coarse sea salt

Line large, rimmed 17-by-12-inch baking pan with foil and spray lightly with cooking spray; set aside.

Spray large glass or metal bowl with cooking spray and place popcorn and nuts inside.

In medium saucepan, combine granulated sugar, butter and corn syrup. Bring to boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Clip on candy thermometer and boil, stirring occasionally, until temperature reaches 290°F (about 15 minutes). Remove candy thermometer and stir in vanilla. Pour mixture over popcorn and stir to coat well.

Spread popcorn mixture in even layer on prepared baking pan. Sprinkle with sea salt and allow to cool completely before breaking into pieces to serve.

Store in an airtight container.

Marmalade Popcorn Balls

Yield: 15 balls

- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 1/4 cups water
- 1 cup orange marmalade
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup light corn syrup
- 1 teaspoon vinegar
- 5 quarts popped popcorn

In saucepan combine sugar, water, marmalade, salt, light corn syrup and vinegar. Bring to boil, stirring until sugar dissolves. Cook to hard-ball stage (250°F).

Pour slowly over popped popcorn and mix thoroughly. Butter hands and shape into 2 1/2-inch balls.
