Water Waste and Northgate

The Northgate Apartments and Maloney Properties take energy conservation very seriously. Over the years much time has been invested in making energy saving materials available to our resident population. These materials are designed to save money not only for the Northgate property as a whole but to help our residents keep their monthly utility bills as low as possible. Energy conservation and its environmental impact on us all is a community concern.

But energy conservation and environmental impact aside, the impact that everyone can agree upon is **MONEY**. Water conservation is a priority as Northgate annually spends approximately **\$200,000.00** to supply water to our community. A recent example can serve to speak volumes as to how water can be wasted quickly and expensively. A single **running toilet that was not called in for repair** caused the monthly water bill for those units served by that particular water meter to rise **100%** over the prior month's billing. **This was no small amount of money but rather an amount that was quite substantial (the savings would mean: almost 3 new stoves, almost 2 new refrigerators or 1⁄2 of a new 2-bedroom kitchen floor!). Saving water means more money for unit improvements or new appliances in need of replacement.**

We ask that any running toilets or any discovered water leaks be immediately called into the Northgate Management Office so that the required repairs can be made in a timely manner. We also ask that you remember that Northgate is a not for profit operation. Money saved is rolled back into the property to the benefit of all of our residents. When a toilet is left to run without repair it is the same thing as opening up your wallet or purse and flushing your dollars down the drain pipe.

RENT PAYMENTS

Please be certain that you apartment number is clearly written on your check or money orders. New move ins and transfers especially need to be aware that this information is correct!

NO GREASE DOWN THE DRAINS!

This cannot be said enough – **DO NOT PUT GREASE DOWN ANY DRAINS AT NORTHGATE!** A buildup of grease in the drain lines causes sewer backups! If you have ever had **one of these backups in your basement, you know it's disgusting, time consuming to clean and very costly to the operating budget, which raises rent!** <u>Please dispose of all grease in the</u> <u>trash!</u> Any household who it is determined has put grease down a drain will be charged for all repairs incurred.

ASSISTANCE DOG OWNERS

A reminder: All assistance animal owners must clean up after their assistance dogs when walking on site. Please be sure to ALWAYS clean up immediately after your dog. There is a bag dispenser for your convenience near the rotary on Northgate Road.

AUTO CALLS

The management office is now using an automatic calling system to inform residents of upcoming events, snow removal and other important messages. Please be sure to listen to your messages when you receive an auto call.



A large group of "Northgaters" have been feeding and watching out for a black and white stray cat (above). It takes a wonderful community to come together and care for a stray animal, especially in the cold Vermont winter. The cat seems to have been out since last spring when he was first spotted. He has been found and has been adopted into his forever home!

Turns out he is gentle, sweet and loves to cuddle! His first toy in his new home was a catnip pillow which he rubbed on, licked, tossed in the air and used as a pillow for his naps. He now has several more toys, playing with one at a time....he enjoys his new scratch post and loves to watch bird and squirrel videos on You Tube!

This kitty has been named "Buddy" due to his friendly and sweet nature. His first trip to the vet included a check for feline leukemia (which amazingly was negative for a stray cat) and all of his shots. He received some medicine for round and tape worms. He appears to be be about 2 years old and is a big boy, weighing in at 12.8 pounds. Of course, his friendliness and charm won over everyone at the vet's office!!

The first 5 nights of Buddy's transition to being an indoor cat were a little rough; although he seemed to be content to be warm and fed, he yowled just about all night wanting to defend his territory, but the 6th night, Buddy was quiet (all night!) and content. He started washing and purring, something that his new cat parents hadn't yet seen.

The vet said he had quite a few battle wounds, but otherwise seemed OK. The vet believes Buddy was domestic and was either let out or got out. Buddy (as of the time of the writing of this article) is awaiting his neutering in just a day or two. He'll get a micro chip too—just in case!!! After about 4 to 5 weeks he will meet his older "sister" who is an 18 year old female cat. The introductions will be slow and careful, but Buddy's new cat parents are hopeful that it will go smoothly.

A note from the Humane Society: please, please, please, if you have a domestic cat (even if they are let out, which is prohibited per Nothgate Pet Policy), DO NOT abandon them to the outdoors thinking they can "take care of themselves". They are domestic and rely on humans for food, warmth, health and companionship. <u>Cats that have been in homes are not ferrel</u> (wild) and being turned out to fend for themselves puts them at risk of disease, hunger, frostbite, predators, stress and death. Call the Humane Society at 802-862-0135 to help place the cat in a new home.

Thank you to all Northgate neighbors who looked out for this kitty whether you spotted him or not! Thanks to Taylor T. and her family who kept a constant vigil to try to catch this elusive fellow; to Linda R., Donna T. and Eva C. and all the surrounding neighbors who fed and worried and prayed for this kitty; and special thanks to Medina S. who helped get him into the cat carrier to finally get him inside and ADOPTED!
