## Recycling in Burlington

It may seem like a “mission-impossible” to navigate the rules around recycling...here in Burlington, we CAN recycle quite a bit: glass, clean aluminum, plastic milk jugs, plastic food containers, pizza boxes (greasy is OK! -- food stuck on is a compostable item!), newspaper, junk mail, newsletters...that have, of course, been read thoroughly 😊 ...but what about plastic grocery bags, bread bags and the like? These can be recycled at various locations throughout the Burlington area. In fact, there is box in the lobby of the management office for collecting these bags. The van crew (see the van schedule for dates and times!) takes them to the grocery store at the beginning of each month to for recycling. The plastic is typically used to make composite lumber. Below are the details and locations of the bag (and thin plastic) recycling locations (if you choose not to bring them to the office). Stop into the management office for an informational sheet that will give you the complete scoop on recycling!

### Plastic bags

#### DISPOSAL OPTIONS

**Plastic bags not accepted** with [blue bin recycling](#). Please do not put filmy plastic of any kind in your recycling bin or cart.

Many local grocery, hardware, and other stores accept plastic bags for recycling. To find a takeback location near you, enter your zip code on the [Plastic Film Recycling website](#).

These common plastic bag types are also accepted at most takeback locations:

- Shopping bags
- Produce bags
- Newspaper sleeves
- Dry cleaning bags
- Cereal box liners
- Sandwich or freezer bags
- Bread bags

**Check with the retailers below about plastic wrap... many will take it as well (thin plastic).**

Some retailers also accept pellet bags, salt bags, and more. Check with the takeback location for their full specifications.

#### COST

There is no charge to participate in a plastic film takeback program.

#### LIMITATIONS, REGULATIONS AND OTHER SPECIFICATIONS

To be accepted at a takeback location, plastic bags must be clean and dry.

#### NOTES

Many supermarkets and chain retailers send plastic film to [Trex](#), which uses the film to make composite lumber for decking and benches. [See their website](#) for a list of items they accept.

## Management News

**AIR CONDITIONER INSTALLATION**--Please remember there is a Northgate Air Conditioner Policy which must be followed when installing an air conditioner in your apartment. **This policy has been approved by the Burlington Fire Marshall. Installing an air conditioner and putting a piece of board on the top is a violation of city fire code.**

If you need an air conditioner installed, please contact the management office. There is a **\$65.00 charge to cover labor, materials and installation.** When summer is over, simply carefully store your air conditioner frame and it can be re-installed the following year.

**SECURITY REMINDER** -Please remember to close and lock your windows and doors when leaving your apartment and going to bed for the night. Security should be in the forefront of everyone's mind these days. Be safe, keep them locked.

**CAR WASHING** -Please remember that due to the high cost of water at Northgate, car washing is strictly prohibited on site. **Northgate pays more than \$15,000 per month** for water for its residents. Anyone found to be washing their car on site will be in **violation of their lease.**

**RENT PAYMENTS**-As residents at Northgate, it is a requirement of your lease that you pay your rent each month on the first of every month. Any rent payments received after the 5<sup>th</sup> of each month are considered late payments. It is important for the financial wellbeing of the property that every household pay their rent on time each month.

**ITEMS ATTACHED TO NEW TRIM**- We have noticed that many households have attached various items to the new trim on the buildings.

The notice that was sent to every household prior to the beginning of the work on each building very clearly states: **"After the new wood trim has been installed and per the Northgate Home Improvement Policy there is to be no drilling or nailing into the vinyl siding, outside trim or fencing."**

**Please be advised that if you have installed these items they need to be removed immediately.**

**DECK EXTENSIONS**- Due to the ongoing exterior rehab work we are asking residents please do not build any deck extensions/new decks in your backyard. As per the Home Improvement Policy, any requests that come into our office will be denied for this reason. Any deck built without prior approval risks being removed when your building is rehabbed.

## From the NROC Boardroom

The NROC Board of directors meeting was called to order at 5:55 p.m. on May 22, 2018.

Resident Open forum: A resident director mentioned that when the power-washing is completed on buildings, moving forward, it would be nice to get a phone call to let residents know that they can leave their windows open.

The board discussed and agreed that discussions happening in Washing DC regarding subsidies should be followed carefully.

Business: Burlington Telecom is coming to Northgate!! BTC will be coming to Northgate and will wire each building as residents call in for the service—this will begin in 2019. There are copies of the BTC proposal in the management office.

**A motion was made to accept the proposal from Burlington Telecom to come to Northgate and proceed as proposed. All were in favor; the motion passed.**

Board Open Forum: Question: Where does Northgate stand on the new law regarding growing marijuana? Answer: NROC (Northgate Residents Ownership Corporation) accepts federal dollars and therefore, despite what the state law is, the federal law takes precedence at Northgate, and possession, use, growing and selling are still illegal on a federal level. The directors asked MPI to draft and send a letter to the full resident membership explaining this and that the current NROC drug and alcohol policy is in full accordance with federal law.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:30

# Summer Safety Tips - Part 3



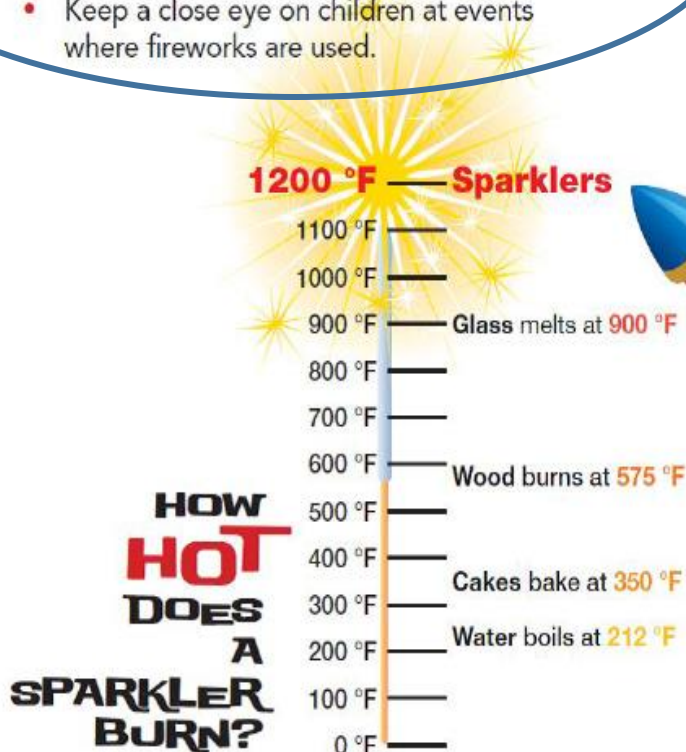
Fireworks are often used to mark special events and holidays. However, they are not safe in the hands of consumers. Fireworks cause thousands of burns and eye injuries each year. People can enjoy fireworks safely if they follow a few simple safety tips:

### BE CAREFUL!

- Be safe. If you want to see fireworks, go to a public show put on by experts.
- Do not use consumer fireworks.
- Keep a close eye on children at events where fireworks are used.

## CONSUMER FIREWORKS

NFPA is opposed to consumer use of fireworks. This includes sparklers and firecrackers. Even sparklers burn hot enough to cause third-degree burns.



### FACTS

- ! Fireworks cause an average of almost 18,500 reported fires per year.
- ! Sparklers account for roughly one-quarter of emergency room fireworks injuries.



## A Tale of the Fourth of July: July 4<sup>th</sup>, 1826

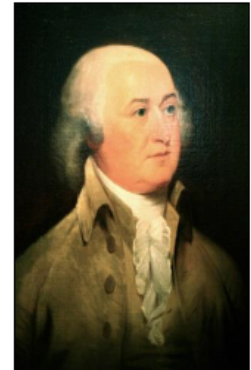
Most Americans celebrate the Fourth of July each year with a summer BBQ, perhaps attend a parade, or listen to a reading of the Declaration of Independence. Then of course there are all those wonderful fireworks displays in the evening. This scenario has pretty much been an American tradition since the year of 1776. July 4<sup>th</sup> of 1826, however, was a uniquely different day. That July 4<sup>th</sup> marked America's 50<sup>th</sup> birthday as a nation. That July 4<sup>th</sup> also noted the deaths of John Adams and Thomas Jefferson.



Jefferson (pictured left and Adams (pictured lower right) have become synonymous with the term, American independence. Adams led the charge in The Continental Congress, pressing for a unanimous vote that would declare Great Britain's 13 American colonies, a free and independent nation. Jefferson of course wrote the defining document of our new nation when he authored the Declaration of Independence. To have both these men pass into history on this day of days was an event truly unique and special. Adams' son, John Quincy Adams, actually saw the hand of God intertwined with the events of that day.

Sick and infirmed, it seemed as if both these men had willed themselves to stay alive long enough to see, one last time, their cherished Fourth. In Quincy, MA, when finally told that it was the Fourth, Adams was heard to say, "It is a great day. It is a good day." Adams would linger on into the day. That afternoon he would speak what those at his bedside recalled as his last coherent words, "Thomas Jefferson survives." Amidst a thunderstorm John Adams' heart stopped beating at 6:20 in the afternoon. Coinciding with Adams' last breath, those with him at the time, "would remember ever after, there was a final clap of thunder that shook the house; the rain stopped, and the last sun of the day broke through dark, low hanging clouds bursting forth...with uncommon splendor at the moment of his exit."

Unknown to Adams, his long-time friend, Thomas Jefferson, had not survived him at all. At Monticello, VA, Jefferson had been lapsing in and out of consciousness since July 2<sup>nd</sup>. On several occasions, he would ask if it was the Fourth? Finally as July the 3<sup>rd</sup> became July the 4<sup>th</sup>, Jefferson was informed that he had indeed lived to see the day that celebrated his greatest accomplishment. Jefferson finally succumbed at 12:50 in the afternoon. It was remembered that this was approximately the same time that his Declaration was presented to Congress on that July 4<sup>th</sup> of 1776, fifty years ago to the day.



Thomas Jefferson wrote his last letter on June 24<sup>th</sup>, 1826. In that letter he expressed his final thoughts on the annual celebration of the Fourth of July, and the nation that he had helped found:



"May it be to the world, what I believe it will be, (to some parts sooner, to others later, but finally to all,) the signal of arousing men to burst the chains, under which monkish ignorance and superstition had persuaded them to bind themselves, and to assume the blessings & security of self-government. That form which we have substituted, restores the free right to the unbounded exercise of reason and freedom of opinion. All eyes are opened, or opening, to the rights of man. The general spread of the light of science has already laid open to every view the palpable truth, that the

mass of mankind has not been born with saddles on their backs, nor a favored few booted and spurred, ready to ride them legitimately, by the grace of God. These are grounds of hope for others. For ourselves, let the annual return of this day forever refresh our recollections of these rights, and an undiminished devotion to them."

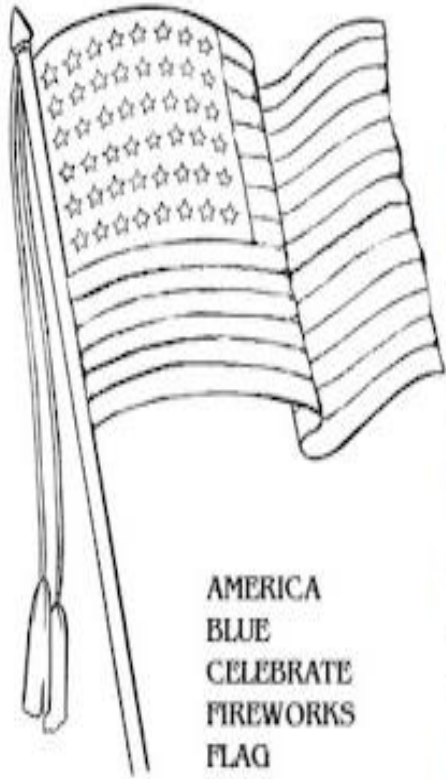
I do believe that John Adams would have agreed with him. Adams too left some thoughts for America and her future generations, "Oh posterity, you will never know how much it cost us to preserve your freedom. I hope that you will make a good use of it, for if you do not, I shall repent in Heaven that I ever took half the pains to preserve it."

John Adams lived to be 90 years of age; Thomas Jefferson 83. Much of their lives were dedicated to building a nation, the likes of which had never been seen before. Both served that nation in varying capacities, including holding the office of President of the United States of America. On each July 4<sup>th</sup>, let us all remember what these men gave to our nation, the opportunity to, "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness;" the opportunity to be a free and independent people.
