July Dumpsters

We are having three dumpsters on Saturday, July 20.Here's the deal though—PLEASE, PLEASE do not overload the dumpsters and PLEASE do not place items on the green belts next to the dumpsters. If this continues, this benefit may have to be discontinued, as it is taking the maintenance team several hours on a Monday morning to get it all cleaned up—not to mention the cost associated with it. In July, one dumpster will be on Fairfield Drive, one on Northgate Road near 348 and one near the end of the 400's.

If you can't fit your items into the dumpster? There will be <u>SIX more</u> dumpsters on site in August, September and October.

Also, please do not dump in the construction dumpsters. This is for construction waste only and is, once again, a cost to Northgate to get cleaned up.

To continue this UNIQUE AND WONDERFUL benefit, please comply with the requests from the maintenance crew to not overload the dumpsters. For the folks who do not understand or haven't read the newsletter regarding why the dumpster process has changed, here again, is the reason: Casella, our trash hauler, has stated that they cannot get 10 dumpsters to us on one day. This makes the driving hours of staff go way over their state D.O.T (Department of Transportation) limits. We are lucky to get three on a Saturday. Further, the one day per year was good for some folks, but not all. Spreading them out over the year makes it fair for all residents who have a variety of work schedules.

Please understand—Northgate is the ONLY community that does this on a regular basis (to our knowledge anyway). We are fortunate that the Board of Directors still wants to have this amid the issues that arise each year. If it all goes smoothly, you can count on another 10 dumpsters in 2020 throughout the year.

EXTERIOR WORK HAS BEGUN!

It's an exciting time at Northgate! J.A. Morrissey has begun the exterior work to be completed on 14 buildings! This includes new doors, decks, siding and canopies over the back doors. Please be certain to read your notices regarding upcoming work. Units #67 through #260 are being completed this year.

BURLINGTON TELECOM

The long-awaited Burlington Telecom will be starting the underground work at Northgate. You will soon have another provider (if you choose) for your phone, internet and cable. Keep watching for information coming to you from Burlington Telecom regarding rates.

RENT PAYMENTS

As residents at Northgate, it is a requirement of your lease that you pay your rent each month on the first of the month. Any rent payments received after the 5th of each month are considered late payments. It is important for the financial well-being of the property that every household pay their rent on time each month.

ITEMS ATTACHED TO NEW TRIM

We have noticed that some households have attached various items to the new trim on the buildings.

The notice that was sent to every household prior to the beginning of the work on each building very clearly states: "After the new wood trim has been installed and per the Northgate Home Improvement Policy there is to be no drilling or nailing into the vinyl siding, outside trim or fencing."

Please be advised that if you have installed these items they need to be removed immediately.

ASSISTANCE DOG OWNERS!

A reminder to all assistance dog owners: Please clean up after your dog! Dog waste is unacceptable in all common areas and back yards at Northgate. Not only is it unsanitary and carries disease, but it is annoying for those who must step over it and dangerous for children who are playing outside this time of year. For your convenience, dog-waste bags are provided for you at the first round-about on Northgate Road. Once you have bagged up your dog's waste, bring it home and dispose in your TRASH—NOT IN YOUR TOILET AND NOT IN ANOTHER RESIDENT'S TRASH TOTER.

All areas at Northgate, <u>including your fenced in back yards</u> must be clean of dog waste AT ALL TIMES! *Thank you!*

CAUTION: CHILDREN AT PLAY

With the warmer weather Northgate children are happily playing outdoors! And sometimes they are riding/running across the roads on site. Please be very cautious when driving on Northgate streets. Too often children don't stop to look for cars – so we MUST watch out for them!

A reminder to parents regarding younger children: If your child is 5 years or younger, YOU or a designated caregiver must be with them when they are outdoors.
