# Wardman Park Development

At the two recent Woodley Park Community Association meetings, developer JBG presented plans to develop the land they own that currently holds the buildings and land of the Marriott Wardman Park Hotel. This development comes in anticipation of the current land zone being changed from Medium Density Residential to High Density Residential, which the District is looking to do around most metro stops.

The plan is in two phases. The first phase would be within a few years' time and would be the construction of a condominium building on Woodley Road between The Woodley Apartments and the Wardman Tower Condominium project, under renovation now. The next phase, which is less immediate, would be for four more residential buildings on the land currently occupied by the hotel, and that border Calvert House land to the north and west. There is no time frame for this as of yet, and the Marriott has a management contract for the site until 2059.

Developer JBG is very community oriented and has already modified plans as a result of these two community meetings. If residents would like to be kept up to date on the subject, they can check with the Woodley Park Community Association for meeting schedules. The WPCA is a great resource for community news.
